## **ICT Donation & RE Digital Resource**

**Donations** A huge thank you to 46.3% of our parents who paid the ICT donation last year. Also to the 52.7% of our parents who paid the RE Digital Resource donation last year. The RE Donation helped to offset the levy charged by the NCRS for the use of this resource with the balance generously donated by the PTA who would have otherwise donated their fundraised money for other school projects.

**So Donations for this year.....** The Board of Trustees has agreed to continue the **ICT Donation** raising it of \$80.00 per child but with a \$200.00 maximum per family. As above, we really need to begin the preparation work for our network in readiness for the high speed broadband that is coming to TA. This money will really help us to do this. The Board also agreed to maintain the **RE Digital Resource Donation**. We have been advised by the NZ Catholic Education Office that this has been reduced from \$16.00 to \$12.00 per child

These donations will be debited to student accounts as a quarterly debt at the beginning of each term

**PLEASE BE REMINDED...** that they are **DONATIONS REQUESTED** not debts to pay, with any donations not paid being credited at the end of the school year. They are however a valuable source of income to the school which last year together raised over \$11.500 which tax deductible (please ask if you require a receipt). Thanks again to those folk who paid these last year... and thank you in anticipation for your payments this year.

**School Assemblies.** Last year we changed the way school assemblies operated with fewer Whole School Assemblies and more team assemblies. This will continue in 2012.

The first Assembly will be on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February (Wk 2) @ 2:30pm which will be a Junior School Assembly (Rms 1-5) and held in the Junior quad area. The first Senior team Assembly (Rms 6-11) will be the following Friday 17<sup>th</sup> February (Wk 3) @ 2:15pm in the school hall. Assemblies will alternate Junior / Senior with a Whole School Celebration Assembly in Week 9 (as week 10 is Holy week).

The whole school assemblies will focus on a celebration of the work carried out in the unit studies across the school.

Our weekly Prayer Assemblies on a Monday morning continue this year.

**Absences...** Just a timely reminder about the process to follow when your child is absent from school.



Because it is a legal requirement that all children attend school in NZ, all absences should be notified formally in writing. Where your child is sick in the morning, a phone call to the office will notify the school, but should be followed by a note from you when your child returns to school. If the absence is known in advance (ie a family trip/ long weekend) this should be notified in writing to the school before the event. If your child is not at school and no notification is received, the school has a responsibility to make contact with you to find out where the child is. You are still expected to furnish a note when your child returns to school.

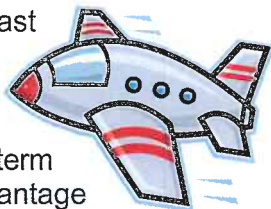
If your child becomes unwell at school, the teacher will send them to the office and a decision will be made to either make contact with you (for them to go home) or if deemed to be minor, some timeout in the sickbay followed by a return to class.

If you are collecting your child from class during school time, please ensure that you come to the office with your child and if they are arriving / returning to school in school time, this should also be done through the office.



### Holidays during term time...

I have noticed that over the past few years there has been a trend developing where families are planning overseas or local holidays in term time. Often this is to take advantage of 'off peak fares' or to holiday in less busy times. While overseas holidays can be a valuable learning experience, please consider that your child is also missing out on valuable learning opportunities within the formal school environment. Please think this through carefully when considering planning these holidays. We are happy to advise...

### School Uniform

The children look great in their summer uniforms ! Just a reminder about hats – students should have the hat as described in the uniform requirements and we enforce a NO HAT - NO PLAY policy. The uniform policy is specific about NO dyed hair and there are specific requirements in regards to jewellery – one plain stud per ear, cultural or religious icons/emblems worn under uniform, watch may be worn. It is also specific about – no makeup or nail polish and long hair tied back (girls & boys) using hair clips or ties of school colours only; navy, maroon, black.

Please be reminded that if your child comes to school in any non-regulation uniform (including hats and footwear) that we require a note from you explaining the reasons why.

### Annual update of our database

This is coming home today with the newsletter to all students. Please read this through, complete as needed, and return to school as soon as possible.

### Bus Children

Our school students are eligible for free bus transport if they live further than 3.2km (under 10 years) or 4.8km (over 10 years) away from the school. If you wish your child to catch the school bus and you live within these limits the cost is \$30.00 per term.



**Parents please could you let the office know if your child is not going home by bus in the afternoon.**

### Bus Safety

The bus children have been told that if they need to cross the road after they hop off the bus they are to wait until the bus has gone past 2 power poles down the road before crossing. If you are waiting for your child's bus to arrive please wait on the same side of the road as the bus stops. Cass Sutton is the Bus Controller this year.

### Delivering/picking up children from school...

We all agree that the safety of our students is paramount. To this end, we ask that when dropping off or picking up your children from St Patrick's, you park in a responsible place and DO NOT double park or stop in front of the driveway entrances.

**Junior school children** please do not pull in to the driveway on Rewi Street to drop off or pick up children as the risks are great when reversing around small children. Children will wait in the Junior courtyard area.

**Other students** wait on the Senior veranda. Parents are expected to **park and collect** children from there.

**Please do not ask your child to wait anywhere else for you as duty teachers are only supervising the two collection points and if seen will tell your child to return to the correct waiting point.**

## Swimming @ St Patrick's



There has been a lot of information in the media recently about the nation's comparatively high statistics for drownings. It is of

concern to us here at school and our goal is **that all students who leave our school have a high level of confidence with good competence around water.** This does not mean that all of our students will be 'heading for the Olympics' in swimming but it does mean that we want our students to learn to **'swim to survive.'**

### ***So what are we doing about it ?***

Last year, all teaching staff attended a PD session and we use the programme. Students in the senior school went out to Raglan late last year for Beach Education. All classes operate a swimming programme with Rms 8-11 using the TA Events Centre and other classes using the school pool from the 1<sup>st</sup> 6 weeks or so. It is important that your child has their swimming gear when required and if you do not wish them to swim (because of illness) a note from you is required. A reminder too about togs – girl's two piece can sometimes be inappropriate for the swimming instructions being set. One piece is far more appropriate.

Programmes using outside venues and providers cost money. We try to minimize any costs and to give advance notice if we can. Students do take part even if they haven't paid as this is charged to student's accounts and so can be paid off.

We are really serious about making our students 'water smart' and look forward to you support !!

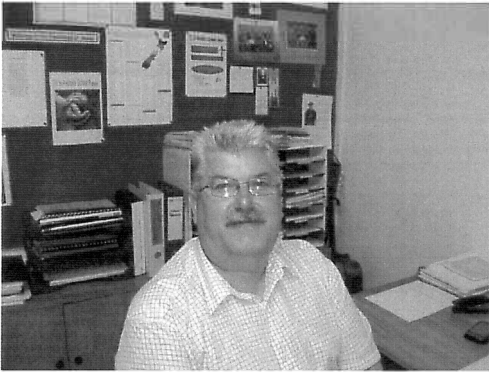

# ***Welcome back to school this year.....***

*And welcome to the many new families who have come to our school...*



*We are excited as 2012 promises to be another great year of learning – and you as our community are definitely a crucial part to your child's learning journey. It is great to see and hear the children being excited at being at school and being eager to learn, long may they continue.*

*Last year's reporting formats which included reporting against the National Standards as we have interpreted these for our community, seemed to be pretty well received. I hope you found these informative and that you gained a clearer insight into what your child can do, what their next steps in learning are and how we together can help your child get there.*

*Goal setting interviews are coming up in early March, at which time we all sit down parent, teacher AND child to set goals for your child's learning and of course in the background is ensuring that these goals are helping your child to achieve the relevant Standard in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. We want these interview discussions, this year much more 'child led' with this becoming much more prominent as we move up the school.*

*Our local school curriculum is pretty much together and we are keen to share this work with you. School-wide units of work will be shared with you both through examples of student's work coming home in their workbooks as 'portfolio samples' and at whole school assemblies where we will be able to show you how the unit concept was developed across the school.*

*The Board of Trustees are developing a strategic plan from which will flow the annual plan – and they would like your thoughts as well. Last year the Board and Parish Council worked closely to develop the shared vision of being 'one community of St Patrick's te Awamutu'. In a practical sense a joint steering group has been formed to refocus the entrance to the school and parish off Alexandra Street by embarking on a building programme - a large gathering area the parish alongside a new administration centre for the school. The first step of handing the parish hall to the school has already occurred.*


*We continue to operate in a very tough economic climate. This makes budgeting very difficult as the school – like all businesses – has to enter into employment agreements and other contracts for services while Government funding levels remain constant. The ICT and RE digital resource donation are valuable sources of income to the school, please consider paying these this year and a huge thanks if you paid these last year.*

*A small hardworking PTA did some wonderful work last year and donated in the region of \$15,000 to the school. They ran some great community events last year – and if you didn't come, you missed some great nights! Watch out for these this year & come along !! – and consider joining the PTA!!*
