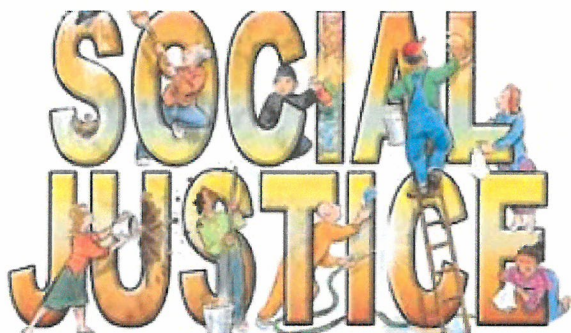

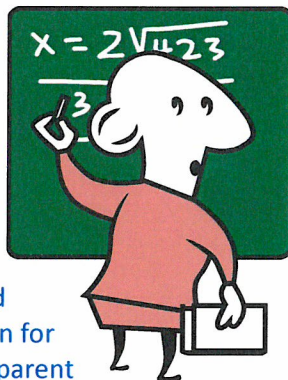

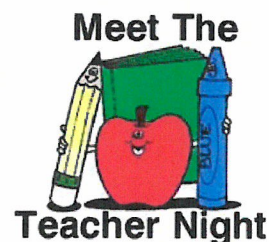

The **Junior School Swimming Sports** are on Friday 7th March at Kihikihi School.


We will need parents to help with timekeeping at these events. If you can help with this event please email me on michelle@stpatta.co.nz.
