PRINCIPAL'S ANNUAL REPORT – 2015.

*E to matau matua i te rangi manaakitia mai matou i tenei ra ake, ake ake Amene
Tihei Mauriora, tena koutou. Ka nui te mihi ki a koutou*



Greetings to you all, in the name of God: Father, Son and Spirit. Greetings to this place and to our ancestors who always go before us.

2015 has been a year of great change, as our school continues to provide quality Catholic Education in an ever increasingly changing, secular world.

Pope John Paul II when speaking to the Catholic Education Association of the United States in 1979, described Catholic Education as being, "Above all a question of communicating Christ, of helping to form Christ in the lives of others." This view was re-affirmed by Pope Benedict XVI in 2008 when he described Catholic educational institutions as places, "to encounter the living God who in Jesus Christ reveals his transforming love and truth." Catholic Schools therefore are, "More significantly, an instrument of the faith of the catholic community than an instrument of any government's education policy or of consumer society's economic and social objectives." (Bishop P.J. Cullinane, address to Catholic Primary Principals, 1981).

These descriptions of the goals and aspirations of Catholic Education are what we are aspiring to and they merely re-affirm what our forebears were on about when St Patrick's was first opened in 1921. As we all know, Jesus was 'on about' community and the presence of Jesus is found within community, and that's not only about when the community gathers for Eucharist, it is about how the community interacts with each other. Catholic Education is a privilege that our families enjoy but there are also expectations with this, as it means that being part of our school means you are part of the parish worshipping community of St Patrick's also. They need you! Our community is the lesser without you... We share a common challenge with nearly every school across the world, that is, finding ways to actively engage with our families who have many pressures on them as they 'grapple' with the busyness of life. Building community needs all of us – and all of us are responsible for the quality of 'community'. It must happen on a daily basis, it has to happen by all of us stepping out there supporting each other, through supporting; 'meet the teacher' evenings, involvement in the PTA, attending school events, fundraising, parent education evenings... These are opportunities that often go by, attended by a 'faithful handful' of people, which seems such a shame, and a disappointment to those who have put time and effort into the planning.

Our vision of one worshipping community has taken a great leap with the completion of the Administration Centre – 'Joseph House' and the Innovative Learning Environment – 'Colgan Centre'. Both of these buildings will be formally opened by Bishop Steve Lowe on Friday 5th February 2016 at 9:15am, and you are invited! While the naming of Administration Centre – 'Joseph House' continues our connection with the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart, the re-naming of the ILE as the 'Colgan Centre' continues the connection with Fr James Colgan who was a parish priest in St Patrick's for many years and there will be a focus on finding out more about the life of Fr Colgan. The development of the ILE will be a great support to the continued development that all of our teachers continue to undertake to equip our students for learning in the 21st Century. As an example, you would have noticed that student interviews have become conferences where the main participant is your child who is talking about their learning and next steps in learning. Digital learning will be much more enhanced with the school's SNUP upgrade completed as part of the building programme, while the senior school will begin trialling 'BYOD' – bring your own devices. Teaching staff will also continue to be involved in professional development around incorporating digital technologies into learning programmes.

Our school continues to use the National Standards Assessment and reporting framework in Reading, Writing and Maths and I believe our teachers are making very accurate 'overall teacher judgements (OTJ's) which includes using moderation process between schools across our network. A breakdown of our results for 2015 as reported on EOY reports show that 93% (91.8% in 2014) of our students achieving at or above the standards in Reading, 89.1% (83.2% in 2014) in Writing and 90.5% (87% in 2014) in Maths. We continued to be involved in Ministry funded intervention programmes in Writing and Maths that have seen targeted groups make considerable accelerated progress and the Maths professional development will widen across the school next year and form part of the robust support systems already in place to enable those students who are currently below the standard to make solid improvements which, for some, will see them reach the relevant standard in 2016. We believe that it is important that all students have success even if this means that for some, they will not meet the standards. We are very blessed with a hugely talented staff and your children are truly very fortunate to have some of the best teachers around. I see them teaching often as I move around the rooms.

Our management team structure took on some changes as we welcomed Marcus Oxenham as our new Assistant Principal and team 3 leader and we split the school into 3 teams - Team 1 : Junior School, Team 2 : ILE and Team 3 Senior School. It was great to be able add to the management team, the leaders of teams 1 & 2 Judy Graham and Aimee Connors. Cass, as Deputy Principal took on schoolwide responsibilities.

Raewyn Jackman as Director of Religious Studies is also part of this team and it is with great sadness that Raewyn leaves us this year. Raewyn has been a great asset and Catholic role model to all in our school and she will be greatly missed. We wish her all the very best as she retires from full time teaching to spend more time with her family. God bless you Raewyn! We are very excited to be able to appoint Gabrielle Balemi to the DRS position from the beginning of next year.

We have had a great team teaching in team 1 under the leadership of Judy Graham and with Gabrielle Balemi (who continued with Reading Recovery this year) with Raewyn Hoskin and Vivien Davies, they have ensured that your children get the very best start to their schooling life. Team 2 began the year knowing that they would be the three teachers moving into the ILE and under the leadership of Aimee Connors with Nicola Prescott, Michaela Jesney and part time teaching with Katharine Eyre, they have really developed into a cohesive teaching team that meant the when the 'move occurred', teachers and students were able to make the transition with relative ease. These teachers are very impressive in their abilities and your children are getting a very good lower middle school education. In team 3 under the leadership of Marcus Oxenham, Raewyn Jackman, Paula Carr and Patsy Wisnewski have done some awesome teaching, by teaching your children to further access the wider curriculum, readying your children for their intermediate learning while Michelle Russ and Marcus Oxenham with Rachel Martin and Amy Knight providing Marcus's release, preparing your young people for secondary learning. With the support of Marcus Oxenham and Patsy Wisnewski, Te Reo Maori programmes operating in all classes and it was great having a Kapahaka group that represented our school at the TA Schools Kapahaka Festival for the fourth year running.

It was with some sadness we farewell Sue Cresswell early this year. Sue was a great asset to our office and often the first friendly voice greeting our parents on the phone. God bless you Sue! And it's been great having the many visits! During the first term we appointed Celena O'Donnell who has joined the 'office team'. Our teaching staff are ably supported by Cathy White and Mary Anne Laidlaw our very talented teacher aides. My thanks to Dana Macdonald, Celena O'Donnell and Patty Dudson in the office who are great support assisting with the administration tasks that are both diverse and demanding. My thanks also to Bibi Nasilasila, Mike Kiely and Vilma Hunwick who look after our physical environment.

Comings and goings next year... Amy Knight has accepted a position as teacher in Room 10 where she will teach with Marcus who will also have team-wide and school-wide responsibilities. Amy will also teach in the ILE on Fridays. Katharine Eyre has accepted a fixed term position in Room 4 for terms 1 & 2. Raewyn Hoskin will continue supporting Gabrielle Balemi in Room 1 while Gabrielle undertakes the Reading Recovery.

My deepest gratitude and thanks to all those who are involved in our community this year; parents and caregivers, teachers and support staff, Board of Trustees and members of the PTA, in particular Maree Orr who, though a small group, continued to fundraise for your kids this year. I am very grateful to the Fundraising group who through the Fashion Show in August raised some extraordinary money for furnishings in the new classrooms. I wish to acknowledge the support and care from our parish priest Fr Joe Stack and the continued support of Sister Margaret. Thank you to the Parish Community especially our 'golden oldies' who pray for our school at daily mass, the wider community of Te Awamutu, our new bishop, Bishop Steve Lowe as proprietor, the Diocesan office staff especially as we have moved through this Building development phase, Br Pat Lynch and staff of the NZ Catholic Education Office (Wellington), local schools, principals and staff in the Rural and Roses Learning & Change Network and the staff at the Ministry of Education both locally and nationally.

We have a number of long established families moving on from our school this year. To these families, we wish you every blessing. May God bless and keep you during this holy time of Christmas!

To Parents and Caregivers of students at St Patrick's Catholic School

I am writing this letter to explain a situation at the school which has caused concern with some parents. Namely, that parents were not afforded the opportunity to keep their children away from school during the cladding removal of Colgan Block (part of the redevelopment of the school).

The concern related to a perceived risk to students whilst cladding was removed from the exterior of Colgan Block (the old relocatable classrooms on the top of the slope).

The type of cladding is well known in the building industry to contain a very small percentage of white asbestos, which is seen as a hazardous material. With this in mind, all contractors who worked to remove and dispose the product into approved landfill and have followed the necessary practice and standards required whilst carrying out this work. The cladding remained in its sheet form and was not cut in any way. The sheets were wrapped and taped and removed from site. The building was then "vacuumed" to ensure any loose material was removed. Contractors have fully complied with Worksafe NZ who have been on site and have approved the methodology and removal process that was followed.

All these steps have been taken by the contractor to ensure the safety of all parties on site during this removal operation.

We can understand that there may have been some concern when removal staff kitted out with white overalls and safety masks were seen on site, but once again, we reiterate, that these protective measures are used whenever there is the chance of asbestos being present on a site.

The comment that all parents should have been notified of the removal we believe was not necessary as the product in question was a solid product with no loose particles so the risk to staff, students and visitors to the school was minimal. A formal task and risk analysis was carried out by the removal company to confirm this approach.

Contractually the area of removal was fully fenced in compliance with the correct and approved removal methodology to ensure people other than contractors were outside the risk area. If the contractors had felt the school community needed to be notified of the risk then the project team and contractors would have advised us accordingly. All parties need to be aware, too, that the contract area is the sole responsibility of the main contractor during the construction and demolition programme and therefore the school has no contractual control over the site. The overall land and buildings are owned by the Bishop of the diocese of Hamilton and is managed in this instance by Graeme Roil, the manager of the Catholic Schools' Office.


Under the Health and Safety in Employment Act if there is any concern by any party then the project manager/construction company must be made aware of and must act on these concerns. As a result of parent concerns the Board of Trustees and Principal contacted the project managers and construction team with the concerns. Once again, we stress that all correct protocols have been followed during this removal minimising the risk to all parties present.

The old admin block is to be demolished over the Christmas break and be aware that all correct safety protocols will be followed during this process. We trust this helps address any concerns that the school community may have.

CHAIRPERSON’S ANNUAL REPORT 2015

Dear Parents, Caregivers and Friends of St Patrick’s Catholic School.

2015 has continued with our successful trend of student results and achievements. We have achieved the requested BOT benchmarks of 90% of students being at or above their National Standards levels for Reading and Maths. Our writing result was 89.10%. These were based on the reports that were presented to parents in week 9 of Term 4. This is another excellent result and rates us as one of the higher student achievement schools in the Waikato area.

The Board has continued to meet its legislative requirement for the year.

We have had two external agencies come into the school and perform reviews this year. In May we had a visit from ERO (Education Review Office) and then in September we had a visit from the Hamilton Diocesan Catholic Character Review team. Both of these review teams provide the opportunity for feedback after assessing where we are at as a school, the delivery of the curriculum and the overall welfare of our students. Are we meeting expectations?

The answer is yes. Both review teams praised the behaviour and the welcome they received from the staff and children. This is extremely pleasing as I believe we pride ourselves on how our children are viewed when they are wearing the uniform.

They both were pleased with the academic achievements that the children are maintaining. At the end of the day, this is our purpose, to educate the children to the best of our abilities and with the resources that we have available. Both agencies urged the school to remind and encourage parents to be active participants in regards to an overall home – school education partnership for your children. We need to be able to foster and reinforce the school time learning at home. In 2016, the Board and the teaching staff will place greater focus on the development and implementation of a formal and published partnership model.

The review teams provided us with some recommended areas for focus in relation to management of the school. Accordingly an action plan has been developed by the Board and this was developed with the Senior Management Team and staff in order that we best address these areas. Some comments have already been achieved. However, as always in a process of improvement; some items are a work in progress. This we can say to you is happening and we are monitoring our progress.

It has also been a year of development with the completion of the new classroom block and the administration block. These are the start of an overall building programme that the School has entered into with the Hamilton Diocesan office. The next phase is not expected until a further 5 years, but we in the meantime can develop our school site. Part of this is the hope that the Church Lounge and Administration building gets a green light, and then the School and Church offices hold the forefront of the property on the main street. The end product I believe is a great overall site plan for both the Church and School.

There was certainly a pleasing evening held in August when a group of parents ran a fundraising fashion night. This was an excellent evening that was well attended and supported. The outcome of this is that the school have been afforded a significant sum of money. This has been designated to go towards the purchase of educational furniture for the new (and old) classrooms. It was a great achievement to those who did the hard yards for this event. And an even bigger thanks to all of the sponsors.

It was pleasing to see this year a higher receipt of donations for Religious Education and ICT. These are essential and required funds into the development of these curriculum areas.

I would like to thank our Principal, Teachers, Students, PTA members and my fellow trustees and to all of you parents who have volunteered or supported the school in events or activity days. We need this support and it is valued and appreciated.


