***This week's question: Do Catholics believe in angels?***

Yes! But probably not the kind of angels you are imagining. Angels are mentioned several times in the Bible and over the centuries artists have created their own image of angels as winged creatures with harps who sit on clouds singing all day. Other people believe that when people die they become angels. This is contrary to what the Church teaches which is that Angels are beings in their own right (they haven't ever been, and won't ever be, human). God created them as his messengers (the word Angel literally means "messenger" in Greek). There are few named angels in the Bible but three of these are Michael, Raphael and Gabriel whose feast day is next week on Saturday. Angels are often invoked as protectors and are thought to be spiritual creatures who were made by God to do His will.

# Lake Rotopiko



On the 19th of September St Patrick's had a whole school trip up to Lake Rotopiko which is on the way to Ohaupo. The Colgan Learning Hub were up first, we were welcomed by Camila, an enviroschools leader, and Caryn an ecologist. They told us some breathtaking facts, no pests are ever in Lake Rotopiko, and birds have many chicks but only a few can survive. We were all divided into equal groups, each group had a choice on where to go, most people decided to go to the Jurassic Forest first. Along the way you would see a sign focusing on one animal, Camila and Caryn had made some books to fill out with some questions. There were small wooden boxes with facts inside. There were many animals to focus on such as tuatara, eels and even the smallest red caterpillar-Fred the Thread. Most people were interested in Fred. Fred the Thread's scientific name is *Houdini Flexilissima*, we learnt some cool facts that Fred the Thread makes beautiful patterns inside a trunk of a tree, he feeds on the wood and when he is ready he makes a hole in the tree and turns into a beautiful moth. Some of the boxes, like the eels, even had little activities and games such as "Eels and Ladders", "Mudfish Scrabble" and "Whose poos?". When we got back Caryn told us some more facts then we did a little activity called "make a tree". We were set up into groups, each person had to be a source of the tree. At 1:20 we packed up and left for school, by the time we got back it was lunch time, and that was when our journey finally ended. It was a great day and everybody extremely enjoyed it, we would like to give a big thanks to Mrs Carr for making this day happen and a thank you to all the parents who came for this adventure!

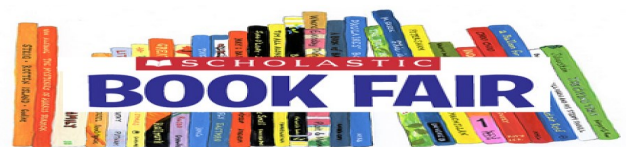
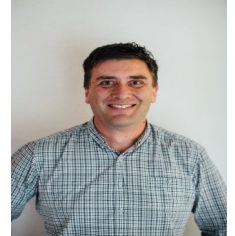
# Meet THE BOARD

### LEARN TO SAIL – School holiday program

Ngaroto Sailing Club are running TWO 3-day learn to sail programs during the October school holidays at lake Ngaroto. The first program is from 30 September to 2 October and the second from 7 to 9 October. Kids will learn the basics of boat handling, knots, tacking, gybing etc.

The program is suitable for children 10+ years old and costs \$150. Boats and lifejackets will be provided.

After completing the course, participants will be able to continue developing their sailing skills through regular club sailing and coaching on Sundays (pre Xmas) and Saturdays from Feb. 2019.
